The AOCR 2027 Contract Signing Ceremony with the Uzbekistan Society of Radiology (URS) was conducted online on November 27th. The attendees included Dr. Noriyuki Tomiyama (President) and Dr. Danny Hing Yan Cho (Honorary Secretary) from AOSR, as well as Dr. Marat Khodjibekov (Chairman), Dr. Lalita Yunusova (Secretary General), and Dr. Yulduz Khodjibekova (Board Member) from URS, along with the AOSR office team.

The 9th Asian Oceanian Radiology Forum (AORF) took place on March 24, 2024, during AOCR 2024 in Taipei, focusing on the theme Radiology Workload and Coverage Hours in Asian Oceanian Countries. Presidents and delegates from 18 AOSR member societies were invited to participate and share firsthand experiences regarding the working hours and burdens faced by radiologists in their respective countries.



In total, 19 countries were represented at the event. Through the presentations, it became clear that the shortage of radiologists is a common issue across Asian countries, largely driven by the increasing demand for radiology services as these nations continue to develop.

I also had the privilege of delivering a speech at the International Trends session during RSNA 2024 in Chicago, on behalf of AOSR. The RSNA International Trends session, held annually, brings together leaders of RSNA international committees and current presidents of international radiology societies at the RSNA Annual Meeting to discuss and share global insights on a common topic of interest. This year's session, held on December 3, 2024, focused on Improving Radiology Through Intelligent Connections. In my presentation, titled Intelligent Connections Addressing Workforce Shortages, I explored how AI, networks, radiology partnerships, and support staff can enhance radiology practices. I highlighted the current challenges of radiologist shortages in Japan and other Asian countries and proposed potential solutions.



Additionally during RSNA 2024, we held the AOSR-RSNA leadership meeting, where we exchanged updates, discussed collaborative initiatives between the two societies, and renewed the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).



AOCR 2025, scheduled for January in Chennai, India, is fast approaching. I have heard from Dr. L. Murali Krishna, the Organizing Secretary of AOCR 2025, that preparations, including the program, are nearly complete. I would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to the Indian Radiological and Imaging Association (IRIA), Dr. Hemant Patel, and the entire AOCR 2025 organizing committee for their hard work and dedication in ensuring the success of this congress. My term as AOSR President will conclude at the Presidential Handover Ceremony during AOCR 2025. Serving as the President has been an extraordinary experience, offering opportunities and insights I had never encountered before. Through this role, I have witnessed AOSR's remarkable growth and solid organizational foundation, and I am confident the society will continue to thrive in the future.

In closing, I would like to extend my sincere thanks to all AOSR Executive Council members and office staff for their unwavering dedication and strong support throughout my presidency.

Getting to know your Member Society - Indian Radiological & Imaging Association

Radiology became an investigating modality in the 20th century and is now prevailing after over a century. It all started in 1895, when Roentgen discovered x-rays. Prof. W.C. Roentgen discovered the mysterious X-ray on 8th November, 1895. The first X-ray machine was imported in 1902 into India; that was only 7 years after the discovery of X-ray.

The 'Indian Radiological Association' was founded in Kolkata in 1931, and the first meeting was held on 21 April 1931. At that time, the members used to meet as a section of the Indian Medical Association. The 'Indian Radiological Association' was registered on 30th March 1937 with the registrar of Joint Stock Companies, Bengal with 24 members. From 1946, the association took a firm hold and started as a coherent, cogent and cohesive association. From 24 members in 1931, it now has more than 26000 members.





The first Annual Congress of Radiology was held in 1946 at Madras under the Presidentship of Dr. M.D. Joshi and Secretary Dr. P. Rama Rao. At that time there were 130 members of the association. Gradually, there was expansion of the Association to other states and a wide network of state chapters was formed. Postgraduate diplomas and degrees were started gradually in all the medical colleges in the country. It was felt rightly that there has been tremendous change in the modalities of imaging all over the world and our Association must effectively reflect by naming a name which will speak for itself. Therefore, keeping with times, the name 'Indian Radiological Association' became the 'Indian Radiological & Imaging Association' (IRIA). The Journal and the College were also renamed accordingly (IJRI and ICRI).

The 'Indian Radiological & Imaging Association' (IRIA) is continuously working to promote the study and practice of diagnostic radiological and imaging modalities, educating the residents, and practicing radiologists on the latest developments in the field of radiology, imaging and radiation medicine apart from promoting the medical research and adopting methods of community welfare. The AOSR Archives Committee was set up to develop the archive policies including what to archive for the purpose of documenting the development, achievements, and history of the AOSR; where possible to keep records which has evidential, historic, and emotional values for the purpose of inspiring our members, and where appropriate for promoting the AOSR regionally and globally.

In this issue of the AOSR Newsletter (December 2024), we wish to highlight one of the AOSR artefacts, the AOSR President's Chain of Office that will be retired for several reasons and introduce its replacement.

The AOSR President's Chain of Office from 1987 retires towards end of 2024

The original AOSR President's Chain of Office was donated by Dr. Federico Principe of Philippines, who was the second AOSR president from 1975–1979 but regrettably, it was lost. It was remade and donated by the Korean Society of Radiology under the leadership of Professor Man Chung Han who was then, the Secretary General of the AOCR 1987 Organizing Committee. It was remade in commemoration of the 5th Asian Oceanian Congress of Radiology, 21–25 September 1987, held in Seoul, South Korea.

The Chain of Office, over the years had become more fragile and worn-out. It was also rather heavy because of additional flags as the AOSR gained more society members. As it had become impractical to add more flags, the Chain therefore did not reflect all the current member societies. In addition, the AOSR now has global individual members.

Discussion about the need to design a new Chain of Office had been mooted several years ago and finally in 2024, the AOSR Constitution, Nomination and Awards Committee under the chairpersonship of Dr Chamaree Chuapetcharasopon, took the initiative to polish the chain, repair any broken links and provide it with a new box.

After deliberation at the AOSR council level and presentation at the General Assembly, the chain would be retired and preserved as one of AOSR's important historical artefacts. The AOSR Archives Committee will be overseeing archival of the few physical AOSR artefacts, at the AOSR secretariat in Seoul.





A new chain was also made and ready for use by October 2024. The first president to use the new chain Professor will be Dr Noriyuki Tomiyama from Japan, whose term will end at the AOCR in January 2025. Professor Dr Byung Ihn Choi, the AOSR 2010-2012 President is shown wearing the Chain of Office which will be retired and preserved whilst Professor Tomiyama, the AOSR 2023-2025 President is shown wearing the new Chain of Office.

Get to know your AOSR Councillor and AOSOR Director: Prof. Yi-Hong Chou, MD

Currently, I serve as Chair Professor of Radiology at Yuanpei University of Medical Technology and National Yang Ming Chiao Tung University School of Medicine in Taipei, Taiwan. I am the former Vice President of Yuanpei University of Medical Technology and the director of Occupational Safety and Health Administration and Chief of Medical Ultrasound and Breast Imaging at Taipei Veterans General Hospital. Now retired, I continue to serve as a consultant at Taipei Veterans General Hospital and Yee Zen General Hospital, Taoyuan.



On the board of AOSR, I serve as the Director of the Asian-Oceanian School of Radiology (AOSOR) (2021-) while I just stepped down from the Vice President I of the World Federation for Ultrasound in Medicine and Biology (WFUMB) in 2021. I am the chairman of the Commission of Research and Development of Medical Ultrasound of the Society of Ultrasound in Medicine of the Republic of China (SUMROC), the chairman of the International Liaison Committee of the Taiwan Radiology Society (TRS), and Editor-in-chief of the Journal of Medical Ultrasound (JMU), the official journal of the Asian Federation of Societies for Ultrasound in Medicine and Biology (AFSUMB).

I am also the past president of the Asian-Oceanian Society of Radiology (AOSR) and AFSUMB, the past president of the Asian Society of Abdominal Radiology (ASAR) and the Asian Breast Diseases Association (ABDA) as well as former president of the SUMROC and TRS. I have served WFUMB, AFSUMB, and AOSR in several capacities, including as Associate Editor of Ultrasound in Medicine and Biology, Associate Editor of WFUMB Ultrasound Open, and Chairs and Members of many Committees.

I have focused much of my research on ultrasound, particularly breast and abdominal applications as well as in the emergency setting. I currently am investigating a variety of Doppler techniques and microbubble contrast agents for evaluating tumor vascularity, and exploring techniques in tumor ablation.

I have been active in scientific and education programs nationally and internationally and have organized many international congresses, workshops, and symposia, particularly on ultrasound and imaging of the liver, breast, emergency, and critical care.



I have been awarded more than 42 honors internationally or domestically. I am an honorary member of the European Society of Radiology (ESR), the Japanese Society of Radiology, the Japanese Society of Ultrasound in Medicine, the Korean Society of Ultrasound in Medicine, the Korean Society of Radiology, and an honorary fellow of the American Institute of Ultrasound in Medicine (AIUM). I am a Gold Medallist of the Asian Society of Abdominal Radiology (ASAR), honorary speaker of the Society of Abdominal Radiology (SAR), honorary president of the Asian Congress of Tumour Ablation ACTA-Taipei, Former President of Asian Breast Association, honorary president of the World Interactive Network Focused on Critical Ultrasound (WINFOCUS) and World Congress of Ultrasound in Emergency and Critical Care.



I have three children, a son and two daughters. All got married and all are physicians. The eldest daughter is a radiologist, the son is a hospitalist, and the youngest is a psychiatrist. They live in San Francisco, Boston, and Pittsburgh, respectively. My wife Mei and I are now grandparents of two lovely grandsons and two beautiful granddaughters. I love painting, hiking, reading, and teaching, and I love my family, students, and colleagues. I always enjoy working with all my friends at AOSR and AOSOR.

Report on the AsiaSafe-IAEA Webinar: 20 Aug 2024

Introduction

The AsiaSafe-IAEA webinar, on 20th August 2024, was a noteworthy event in the domain of nuclear medicine and radiopharmaceuticals. The session was moderated by Professor Kwan Hoong Ng and featured welcome addresses from esteemed individuals: Professor Noriyuki Tomiyama, President of the Asian Oceanian Society of Radiology (AOSR), and Dr. Ola Holmberg, Head of the Radiation Protection of Patients Unit at the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) in Vienna, Austria.

Speakers and Presentations

Dr. John B.T. Kung

Dr. John B.T. Kung, Consultant in Charge at the Nuclear Medicine Unit and Hospital Authority Clinical PET Centre, Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Hong Kong, delivered a presentation entitled "Advancements in Theranostics using Unsealed Radiopharmaceuticals for Neuroendocrine Tumours: Experiences from a Local Perspective." His presentation elucidated the practical applications and benefits of these advancements from a local perspective.

Dr. Julia Brosch-Lenz

Dr. Julia Brosch-Lenz, a Medical Physics Expert from the Institute of Nuclear Medicine, Bethesda, Maryland, USA, presented on the topic "Medical Physicist's Perspective: Radiation Protection in the New Era of Radiopharmaceutical Therapies." Dr. Brosch-Lenz gave her outlook on rapidly evolving nuclear medicine theranostics with new technology and radiopharmaceuticals (specially targeted alpha therapies) being constantly developed. Her presentation encompassed the guidelines, best practices, and challenges faced in this rapidly advancing field, emphasizing the paramount importance of maintaining high standards of radiation safety. Radiation protection for the patient, employees and environment were presented.
